personal study questions

Read Romans 6:12-14

- Is it possible for a Christian to let sin reign in their life? Why or why not?
- What are the “members” that Paul refers to in this passage? List four “members” that you think are involved here. (Hint: There are more than four to choose from.)
- How might we present these four members to God as instruments of righteousness?
- What are some symptoms of a life that is obeying sin’s passions?
- Why do you think Paul calls these members “instruments” that can be used either for unrighteousness or for righteousness?
- What might keep us from presenting our members to God as instruments of righteousness?
- What might we passively do to “let sin reign” in our mortal body?
- How might we present these four members to sin as instruments of unrighteousness (Consider them separately and specifically.)
- What might motivate us to present our members to God?
- What sins tempt you to fall back under their slavish power? What do you do to be free of these sins?
- How can we avoid presenting each these members as instruments of unrighteousness?
- How often should we present our members to God? What specific applications might you draw from this command?
